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An equitable health service is currently understood to mean "one where individuals' access to and utilization of the service depends on their health status alone." There is strong evidence that lower socioeconomic groups use services less in relation to need than higher groups because the poor lack Access, which is defined as "the ability to obtain effective health care services in a timely fashion, when medically needed"

The current scenario is far cry from the Constitutional mandates regarding the Government's duty to ensure that everybody in the country—irrespective of means, age, sex, or occupation—shall have equal opportunity to benefit from the best and most up to date medical and allied services available." In fact research suggest that monitoring of improvements in health equity is a barometer of improvements to social and political structures.

Along side equity, the issues of quality and safety in health care has been a major concern. In simple terms quality health care may be defined as "doing the right things, at the right time, for the right people, and doing them right—first time". In this context, revolution in information networking has given massive boost to consumer campaign for quality medical care and patient safety. Today's patient are more informed and aware about their rights to quality and safety. This public sentiment for instance is reflected by World Alliance for Patient Safety, that brings together the WHO guidelines for ongoing campaign on hand hygiene, blood safety, injection and immunization safety, safer clinical practices, and safe water, sanitation and health care waste management. There is paradigm shift in understating of patient safety, wherein instead of focusing on poor performance of individual provider (blame game), the current concepts of patient safety put great emphasis on deficiencies in system design, organization and operation.

The conference is seeking participation from all stakeholders like health care providers, Pharmaceutics, professional institutions/ societies, Health executives and legislators and patient advocacy groups with the following objectives :

1. To enhance understanding and exchange information about key issues that impact equity, quality and safety in health care.
2. To facilitate union of disciplines and organizations across the continuum of care, for collaborative, inclusive, multi-stakeholder approach.

The conference is preceded by a one day workshop on advances in the emergency department management of infected wounds.
